## How do I handle wallpaper around electrical outlets and switches in my Ottawa home?

**Removing wallpaper around electrical outlets and switches requires shutting off power at the breaker and removing the outlet covers before you begin.** Start by turning off electricity to the room at your main panel, then unscrew and carefully remove all outlet covers, switch plates, and light fixture covers to expose the wallpaper edges underneath.

In Ottawa's older homes, this step often reveals decades of wallpaper layers that previous owners simply cut around rather than properly removing. The area behind electrical covers frequently holds the most stubborn adhesive because it's been protected from moisture and hasn't experienced the same expansion and contraction as exposed walls. You'll likely find multiple paper layers, old paste buildup, and sometimes even paint over wallpaper — a common shortcut in Ottawa's heritage neighbourhoods like the Glebe and Centretown.

Use a scoring tool to perforate the wallpaper around the electrical box openings, being extremely careful not to score into any visible wiring. Apply wallpaper removal solution generously and let it penetrate for the recommended time — usually 15 to 30 minutes depending on the product. A steamer works well for stubborn areas, but keep it moving to avoid overheating electrical boxes or melting any plastic components. Scrape gently with a putty knife, working from the outside toward the electrical opening to avoid tearing the paper in hard-to-reach corners.

**Never attempt this work with the power on, and never spray removal solution directly into electrical boxes.**

If you discover knob-and-tube wiring, aluminum wiring, or any damaged insulation during removal, stop work and consult an ESA-licensed electrician before proceeding. Ottawa homes built before 1950 often contain outdated electrical systems that require professional assessment. Additionally, if you're working in a heritage conservation district and the wallpaper removal reveals original plaster details or decorative elements, check with the City of Ottawa about heritage requirements before painting or re-papering.

## What types of wallpaper are best for a nursery accent wall in an Ottawa home?

For a nursery accent wall in Ottawa, **peel-and-stick vinyl wallpaper** or **pre-pasted paper wallpaper** are your best options, offering the perfect balance of safety, durability, and future flexibility. Avoid traditional vinyl wallpapers with strong adhesives or textured grasscloth that can harbor dust and allergens in a baby's room.

Ottawa's dry winter air (often below 20% humidity with forced-air heating) actually works in your favor for wallpaper installation and longevity. The low humidity prevents the adhesive issues and edge lifting that plague wallpaper in more humid climates. However, our dramatic seasonal humidity swings—from bone-dry winters to humid summers—mean you want a wallpaper that can handle expansion and contraction without bubbling or peeling.

**Peel-and-stick options** (\$25 to \$60 per roll covering about 20 square feet) are ideal for nurseries because they remove cleanly without damaging drywall underneath, use low-VOC adhesives, and allow you to easily change the design as your child grows. ## Is Wallpaper Making a Comeback for Ottawa Home Interiors?

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## How Do I Remove Old Wallpaper from Plaster Walls in an Older Ottawa Home?

Removing wallpaper from plaster walls in an older Ottawa home is a project that requires patience, the right tools, and respect for what is underneath. Many Ottawa homes — especially in **The Glebe, Sandy Hill, Old Ottawa South, Centretown, and Rockcliffe Park** — have original horsehair or lime plaster walls dating back 80 to 130 years. Damaging that plaster during wallpaper removal can turn a cosmetic project into a structural repair job very quickly.

### Assess What You Are Working With

Before you start stripping, identify two things:

#### What type of wallpaper is it?

- **Vinyl or vinyl-coated:** Has a slight sheen, feels almost plasticky. The vinyl top layer peels off in sheets, leaving a paper backing adhered to the wall. This is actually the easiest type to deal with.
- **Traditional paper wallpaper:** Fully paper-based, absorbs water readily. Common in Ottawa homes from the 1950s through 1980s.
- **Painted-over wallpaper:** This is the nightmare scenario, and it is extremely common in older Ottawa homes. Previous owners painted latex or oil paint directly over the wallpaper (sometimes multiple layers over multiple wallpaper layers). This is the hardest to remove and requires the most care.

**What condition is the plaster in?** Press gently on the walls in several spots. If the plaster feels **spongy, hollow, or moves when pressed**, the plaster keys (the mechanical bond behind the lath) have broken. Aggressive wallpaper removal techniques can cause loose plaster sections to fall away entirely. **Budget for plaster repairs** if the walls feel anything less than rock solid — patches run **\$150 to \$400 per area** from an Ottawa plasterer.

### The Step-by-Step Removal Process

#### Step 1: Protect the Room

- Lay **heavy-duty canvas drop cloths** on the floor (not plastic — it gets dangerously slippery when wet)
- Remove outlet covers and light switch plates
- **Turn off power to the room at the breaker panel.** Plaster walls in old Ottawa homes often have knob-and-tube or early Romex wiring, and you will be using water near electrical boxes. This is a genuine safety issue.
- Tape plastic over all outlets and switches even with power off

## Step 2: Score the Surface

Use a **wallpaper scoring tool** (the Paper Tiger is the most common brand, about **\$10 to \$15** at any Ottawa hardware store). Roll it across the entire wall surface to create tiny perforations in the wallpaper. This allows your removal solution to penetrate behind the paper.

**Critical warning for plaster walls:** Use **light pressure only**. The scoring tool has small spiked wheels that can gouge into soft lime plaster if you press too hard. You only need to puncture the wallpaper — not dig into the wall underneath.

## Step 3: Apply Removal Solution

You have two effective options:

**Commercial wallpaper remover** (DIF is the most popular brand): Mix according to directions and apply with a **pump sprayer or sponge**. A bottle of concentrate costs about **\$10 to \$15** and makes several gallons. Spray a section about 4 feet wide, let it soak for **10 to 15 minutes**, then test a corner. If the paper slides off easily, you are ready. If not, apply more solution and wait.

**Hot water and fabric softener:** Mix **one part liquid fabric softener to three parts hot water** in a pump sprayer. This DIY method works surprisingly well and costs almost nothing. The surfactants in the fabric softener break down wallpaper adhesive effectively.

**Avoid soaking plaster walls excessively.** This is the key difference between plaster removal and drywall removal. Drywall can handle a fair amount of moisture; old plaster absorbs water and can **soften, crumble, or delaminate from the lath**. Apply removal solution in sections and work those sections before moving on. Never let solution sit on plaster for more than 20 minutes.

## Step 4: Scrape Carefully

Use a **4-inch or 6-inch flexible putty knife** — not a stiff scraper. Hold it at a low angle (about 30 degrees) to the wall and slide it under the wet wallpaper. The paper should come off in strips with moderate effort.

**Do not use a rigid paint scraper or 5-in-1 tool** — these gouge plaster instantly. The flexible putty knife bends against the wall surface and follows the contours of the plaster.

For **painted-over wallpaper**, you may need a **wallpaper steamer**. You can rent one from Ottawa tool rental shops for about **\$30 to \$50 per day**. Hold the steam plate against the wall for 20-30 seconds, then scrape while the paper is hot and soft. Steam is more effective than liquid on painted-over layers because the heat helps break down both the paint and the adhesive.

## Step 5: Clean the Walls

Once all paper is removed, wash the walls with a sponge and warm water to remove residual adhesive. You will feel the adhesive as a **sticky or tacky film** when you run your hand over the surface. It must be completely removed before priming or painting — leftover adhesive causes paint to bubble and peel.

For stubborn adhesive residue, use **trisodium phosphate (TSP)** mixed with warm water. TSP is about **\$8 to \$12** at Ottawa hardware stores. Wear gloves — it is mildly caustic.

## Step 6: Repair and Prime

Inspect the plaster for:

- **Cracks:** Fill with **setting-type joint compound** (Durabond 90 is excellent for plaster). Do not use lightweight spackling — it shrinks and cracks over plaster.
- **Gouges or dings:** Build up with multiple thin layers of joint compound, sanding lightly between coats
- **Loose sections:** If plaster has separated from the lath, it needs professional repair. Plaster re-keying or replacement in Ottawa costs **\$200 to \$500 per section** depending on size.

Prime the repaired walls with a **high-quality primer** like Zinsser BIN (shellac-based) or Kilz Original. These block any remaining adhesive residue and provide a uniform surface for paint. A gallon runs **\$30 to \$45** and covers about 300 square feet.

## What Type of Wallpaper Works Best in Ottawa Bathrooms with High Humidity?

Bathrooms are one of the trickiest rooms to wallpaper anywhere in Canada, but Ottawa presents an additional challenge that most wallpaper guides do not address: **extreme seasonal humidity swings**. Your bathroom goes from a steamy shower environment to bone-dry winter air (sometimes below 25% indoor humidity) and back again, hundreds of times per year. The wallpaper you choose needs to handle all of it.

### The Best Wallpaper Types for Ottawa Bathrooms

#### Solid Vinyl Wallpaper — The Top Choice

**Solid vinyl** is the gold standard for bathroom applications in Ottawa. Unlike vinyl-coated paper (which has a paper backing with a thin vinyl face), solid vinyl is **vinyl through and through** — both the decorative surface and the backing are synthetic.

Why it works in Ottawa bathrooms:

## What to Avoid in Ottawa Bathrooms

**Natural fibre wallpapers (grasscloth, jute, seagrass, cork):** These are beautiful but they **absorb moisture like a sponge**. In an Ottawa bathroom, they will develop mould within months. Save these for living rooms and bedrooms.

**Traditional paper wallpaper without any vinyl coating:** Paper + moisture = disaster. The adhesive fails, the paper buckles and bubbles, and mould grows behind it where you cannot see it.

**Flocked wallpaper:** The raised textile surface traps moisture and is nearly impossible to clean in a bathroom environment.

**Untreated fabric wallpaper:** Same problem as natural fibres — moisture absorption leads to mould and adhesive failure.

## Installation Tips Specific to Ottawa Bathrooms

**Use moisture-resistant adhesive.** Standard wallpaper paste is not designed for prolonged humidity exposure. Products like **Roman PRO-543 Universal** or **Roman PRO-838 Heavy Duty** are rated for high-humidity environments. A gallon costs **\$15 to \$25** and covers approximately 250-300 square feet.

**Prime the walls with a moisture-barrier primer.** Before hanging any wallpaper in an Ottawa bathroom, apply a coat of **Zinsser Gardz** or a similar problem-surface sealer. This creates a barrier that prevents moisture from migrating through the wall and attacking the adhesive from behind. Especially important in older Ottawa homes where bathroom walls may not have a vapour barrier. Cost: **\$25 to \$40 per gallon**.

**Seal all seams and edges.** Apply **vinyl seam adhesive** to every seam after installation. Pay special attention to edges near the tub, shower, and sink backsplash. A tube of seam adhesive costs about **\$8 to \$12** and prevents the biggest failure point in bathroom wallpaper.

**Ensure adequate ventilation.** This is arguably the most important factor for wallpaper longevity in Ottawa bathrooms. 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## Can I Install Peel-and-Stick Wallpaper Over Painted Walls in My Ottawa Condo?

Peel-and-stick wallpaper over painted walls is one of the most popular condo upgrade projects in Ottawa right now, and for good reason — it is **renter-friendly, relatively affordable, and does not require professional tools or adhesive**. But whether it actually works well depends on a few factors specific to your walls and Ottawa's indoor climate.

### The Quick Answer

**Yes, you can install peel-and-stick wallpaper over painted walls** — as long as the paint is in good condition and you prep the surface properly. Most Ottawa condos built in the last 20 years have smooth drywall with latex paint, which is actually the **ideal surface** for peel-and-stick products.

### Wall Conditions That Work

**Smooth, clean, fully cured latex paint** on drywall is the best surface for peel-and-stick wallpaper. If your Ottawa condo has smooth walls with eggshell or satin finish paint, you are in excellent shape.

### Wall Conditions That Cause Problems

**Freshly painted walls:** Latex paint takes **30 days to fully cure**, even though it feels dry to the touch within hours. Peel-and-stick wallpaper applied over uncured paint will bond to the paint film, and when you eventually remove the wallpaper, **it will pull the paint right off the wall with it**. If you just painted, wait a full month.

**Textured walls:** Some Ottawa condos (especially those built in the 1970s through 1990s) have **orange peel, knockdown, or stippled ceiling texture** that extends onto the walls. Peel-and-stick wallpaper does not adhere well to textured surfaces — the adhesive only contacts the high points, leaving air gaps behind. The wallpaper will bubble, sag, and eventually fall off. If your walls have texture, you will need to either **skim coat the walls smooth** (\$2 to \$4 per square foot for professional skim coating in Ottawa) or switch to traditional paste-applied wallpaper.

**Walls with moisture issues:** Some Ottawa condos, particularly older ones and those with north-facing exterior walls, develop **condensation or moisture behind the drywall** during winter. If you notice any dampness, peeling

paint, or musty smell, address the moisture issue before applying any wallpaper. Peel-and-stick over a damp wall traps moisture and promotes mould growth.

**Walls with multiple layers of old paint:** This is common in resale Ottawa condos. If the paint is thick, cracked, or flaking in any areas, the peel-and-stick adhesive can pull loose paint off the wall. Test adhesion by pressing a strip of painter's tape firmly to the wall and pulling it off quickly. If paint comes with it, the wall needs **scraping, priming, and repainting** before wallpaper application.

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## How Do Ottawa Professionals Handle Wallpaper Seams That Are Lifting or Bubbling?

Lifting and bubbling seams are the most common wallpaper complaint Ottawa professionals deal with, and our city's extreme indoor climate swings make these issues more prevalent here than in more temperate parts of Canada. The good news is that most seam problems are **repairable without removing the wallpaper entirely** — if you catch them early and use the right technique.

### Why Seams Lift and Bubble in Ottawa Homes

Understanding the cause determines the fix:

**Seasonal humidity cycling** is the primary culprit in Ottawa. When your furnace runs from October through April, indoor humidity can plummet to **20-25%**. **Step 1: Soften the old adhesive.** Using a small artist's brush or a cotton swab, apply warm water along the underside of the lifted seam. **Step 3: Press and roll.** Press the wallpaper back against the wall and roll the seam firmly with a **wallpaper seam roller** (\$5-\$8 at hardware stores). Apply consistent, firm pressure along the entire seam length. Wipe away any adhesive that squeezes out with a damp sponge immediately — dried adhesive residue on the wallpaper surface is difficult to remove.

**Step 4: Support while drying.** For stubborn seams, apply **painter's tape** over the repair to hold the wallpaper flat against the wall while the adhesive sets (typically **2 to 4 hours**). Remove the tape gently after the adhesive has cured.

## For Bubbling (Air Pockets Under the Wallpaper Surface)

**Small bubbles (under 25mm / 1 inch):** Professionals use a **hypodermic-style wallpaper adhesive injector** or a syringe with a fine needle. Pierce the bubble at the bottom edge with the needle, inject a small amount of seam adhesive, then press flat with a roller. The tiny puncture hole is invisible once the paper dries flat.

**Large bubbles (over 25mm):** Using a sharp **utility knife with a fresh blade**, make a small slit at the bottom of the bubble — just large enough to insert the tip of an adhesive tube or syringe. Inject adhesive, press flat, and roll the seam. The slit should be cut **along the pattern lines** so it becomes invisible once the paper lies flat.

If the bubble contains trapped air only (no adhesive failure behind it), you may be able to simply **pierce it with a pin** and press the air out without adding adhesive. This works for bubbles that formed during installation but were not noticed until after the paste dried.

## For Seams That Keep Failing

If the same seams keep lifting despite repairs, the underlying adhesion has fundamentally failed — usually due to wall prep issues or moisture intrusion. In this case, Ottawa professionals recommend:

- **Carefully peel back the wallpaper** at the failed seam (about 25-50mm on each side)
- **Scrape away all old adhesive** from both the wall and the back of the wallpaper
- **Apply wallpaper primer** (like Zinsser Gardz) to the exposed wall area and let it dry completely
- **Re-paste the wallpaper** using full-strength wallpaper adhesive (not just seam adhesive), press firmly, and roll

This more invasive approach addresses the root cause rather than just patching the symptom.

## Prevention Strategies for Ottawa Homes

## Can I wallpaper over existing wallpaper in my Ottawa home or must I strip it first?

The short answer is: **you should almost always strip the old wallpaper first.** I know that's not what you want to hear — stripping wallpaper is tedious, messy work — but layering new wallpaper over old almost always creates problems, and Ottawa's climate makes those problems worse. Let me explain why, and cover the rare exceptions.

### Why Stripping First Is the Right Call

- Any existing **mould, mildew, or moisture damage** behind the old paper gets sealed in rather than addressed — a genuine health concern
- Future removal becomes exponentially harder with multiple layers (your next project becomes a nightmare)

### **The Rare Exceptions**

There are a few narrow situations where wallpapering over existing paper can work:

#### **Single layer of smooth, vinyl-coated wallpaper** that is:

- Firmly bonded with no lifting, bubbling, or peeling anywhere
- Completely smooth with no textured pattern
- Clean and free of grease, smoke residue, or staining
- On a flat, stable wall (not plaster with underlying cracks)

Even then, you'd need to **score the old vinyl surface** with a scoring tool so the new adhesive can grip, then apply a **bonding primer** before hanging new paper. And you accept the risk that Ottawa's seasonal extremes may still cause issues down the road.

**Lining paper over old wallpaper** is another option professionals sometimes use. A heavy-duty **lining paper (1000-1200 grade)** applied horizontally can bridge minor imperfections and create a fresh bonding surface. This adds **\$1.50 to \$3.00 per square foot** to your project but is still faster than full stripping in some cases.

### **The Stripping Process for Ottawa Homes**

The approach depends on your wall type and existing wallpaper:

#### **For drywall (post-1960s homes, common in Kanata, Barrhaven, Orleans, Riverside South):**

- Score the wallpaper surface with a **Paper Tiger scoring tool** (\$10-\$15)

- Let it soak for 15-20 minutes

## What is the best adhesive for wallpaper in Ottawa homes with older plaster walls?

Adhesive selection for plaster walls is one of those details that separates a wallpaper job that lasts 15 years from one that starts peeling after two Ottawa winters. Delicate wallpapers like **grasscloth, silk, and natural fibres** require a **clear-drying adhesive** because any paste that squeezes through the weave will stain the face permanently. **Roman GH-34 Grascloth Adhesive** or **Metylan Special** are purpose-built for this. They cost **\$35 to \$50 per gallon** but are non-negotiable for specialty papers — using the wrong adhesive on a \$200/roll grasscloth is an expensive mistake.

### For Maximum Durability: Two-Part Adhesive System

Some professional installers in Ottawa use a **two-part approach** on plaster walls:

- Apply a thin coat of **border/overlap adhesive** (like Roman PRO-880) directly to the wall at seam locations

- Apply standard heavy-duty paste to the wallpaper strips as normal

This double-bonding at seams specifically addresses the **seam-lifting problem** that Ottawa's winter dryness causes. The border adhesive creates a permanent bond at the vulnerable edges while the main adhesive handles the field. ## Critical Prep Steps for Plaster Walls

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## Can I Use Wallpaper in an Ottawa Basement or Will Moisture Cause It to Peel?

You absolutely can wallpaper an Ottawa basement — but you need to respect the reality that **Ottawa basements are some of the most moisture-challenged spaces in Canadian residential construction**. Between spring snowmelt, the high water table in many Ottawa neighbourhoods, and summer condensation, a basement wallpaper job done without proper prep will fail within one to two years. Done right, though, it can last a decade or more.

### Why Ottawa Basements Are Tough on Wallpaper

Ottawa sits in the **Ottawa River Valley** with a mix of clay, silt, and Leda clay soils that hold water like a sponge.
